



California laws about shooting a firearm require that anyone renting/shooting a firearm must be of legal age, OR be with someone of legal age that has the legal right (parent/Guardian) to allow them to handle a firearm, OR has been given written permission (see our [PARENT PERMISSION FORM](#) in the Scouting section). For pistols that is anyone 21 years of age or older. For rifles it is 18 years of age.

Anyone who wants to shoot **MUST** have current picture ID
(except for minors)

NO EXCEPTIONS

We check everyone and feel very bad about having to turn away someone for lack of proper ID.

We further require (insurance reasons) that you be in a party of two or more of the proper legal age. Exceptions to this rule are: you have your own firearm(s) with you, range membership of at least ten (10) days, Law Enforcement, active military, Government Agencies, known experienced shooters, or certified instructors.

First time shooters usually take a basic pistol class of one kind or another. We offer two types during each month; NRA basic pistol safety and Women's personal protection. Each covers basic firearm safety and operation. Please review our web page for course descriptions - www.ontargetrange.net

We do offer private lessons with NRA certified instructors, but they are on an appointment basis only. Cost is \$130 per hour, there **MUST** be two people per session for the hour for safety and insurance reasons.

Should you want to "just come in", you will need to come with someone else over 18 years of age to shoot rifle - we rent several different types - or 21 or older for pistols. Bring your ID and explain at the counter you have limited experience. IF possible, based on how busy the range is at the time, we may be able to just help you along with some instruction. But we don't recommend it or encourage learning to shoot that way. And we may turn you away as a safety concern/judgment of the RSO at the counter.

Your safety and those around you are our primary concern at all times. Come enjoy yourself, but let's do it safely.
